'John was Nicholas' elder brother, his devoted disciple and first biographer. He suffered exile during the civil war for his royalist sympathies. He died at Little Gidding in 1657'.

Nicholas Ferrar III	Ferrar, Nicholas, 1620-1640		Born 1620 in London, England; son of John Ferrar and Bathsheba Owen

John Ferrar III	Ferrar, John, 1660-1737		Son of John Ferrar II and Anne Brooke
Reverend Thomas Ferrar	Ferrar, Thomas, 1663-1739		Son of John Ferrar II and Anne Brooke; born 1663 in Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire, England; baptized June 24, 1663 in Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire, a graduate of Pembroke College, Cambridge; married Martha Goddard; was Rector of Little Gidding from 1691-1707, Steeple Gidding from 1691-1739, and Sawtry St. Andrew from 1706-1739)
Edward Ferrar	Ferrar, Edward, 1671-1730		Youngest son of John Ferrar II and Anne Brooke
Edward Ferrar II	Ferrar, Edward, 1696-1769		Eldest son of Edward Ferrar (1671-1730)
John Ferrar IV	Ferrar, John, 1700-1739		Son of Ferrar, Thomas, 1663-1739 and Martha Goddard; born 1700 in Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire; B.A. 1721- 1722; M.A. 1725; Fellow of Pembroke College, Cambridge, 1722-1739; Junior Proctor, 1736-1737; Ord. deacon (Lincoln) Aug. 17; priest, Sept. 21, 1735; Vicar of Everton and Tetworth, Hunts., 1735-1739; died March 1739 in Little Gidding, Huntingdonshire.

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Michael Lloyd Ferrar	Ferrar, Michael Lloyd, 1839-1904		Michael Lloyd Ferrar; a former member of the Bengal Civil Service; made his home at "Little Gidding," Ealing. Michael Lloyd Ferrar; of "Little Gidding," Ealing, Middlesex; scholar and prizeman of Trinity College Dublin; born November 24, 1839 in Newry, Down, Ireland; son of Michael Lloyd Ferrar (1799-1884) and Mary Minchin; married Rose Margaret O'Donnell on November 10, 1870 in India; Bengal Civil Service, 1861, Assistant Magistrate and Collector, Bengal, 1863; Commissioner, Oudh, 1889; retired in 1893; died April 23, 1904 in "Little Gidding", Ealing, London.
