In the experimental performance *After Abstraction*, paintings interconnect with music and an exhibition meets its creation process. Inhabiting the exhibition space, a vocal ensemble led by Syamala Roberts and Lea Luka Sikau interprets musical works that inspired Rix while she worked in her atelier, ranging from Ariel Ramírez's *Missa Criolla* to the choral music of Johann Sebastian Bach. The performance moves painting and music 'beyond the lines', touching upon the repercussions and resonances of Anglo-German history and poetry.

After Abstraction accompanies the exhibition Cross-connections, which brings together Rix's paintings and the work of her mother, Helga Michie, to explore how movement and migration is articulated across space, time and different media.
